Base


For the base you can use any light-coloured bead, I used Opaque Luster Ivory DB421, but any light colour will do. Make the base with the one colour until row 15.



Bold - Corners NC - No corner DC- decrease (go through with out adding bead and pull tight.)



Row 2 added on to the base.



Row three, adding in one corner bead, keep a fairly tight tension as you work, this will help pull the corners together.



Row three continued, you can see that it has started to curve up, with the row finished. This will continue as you add in row four, and then straighten up as you add in more rows until you decrease again.



Row 11 instead of adding a bead in the corners you will just take the thread through and as you bead the row with a firm tension this will pull the corner together. You can also wiggle the beads into place with your needle if you are not satisfied with their position. Also **Row 22 & 33**



Row 12 add one bead in the gap and keep a firm tension, then continue as normal. Also **Row 23 & 34**



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
