## '1 heart - 3 ways' - Part 2

## Rainbow Hearts Bracelet by Karen Gibson-Brown

## Shopping list...

$2 \mathrm{~g} x$ size 11 cylinder beads in each of the 12 IBW colours
$5 \mathrm{~g} \times$ size 11 cylinder beads - white
$5 \mathrm{~g} x$ size 11 Miyuki seed beads - white
Size 10/12 needle
White KO thread or thread of choice
Clasp of choice
'One heart, 3 ways', is a three-part set of projects, designed for IBW 2023: earrings, a bracelet, and a pendant. Each of the projects use the same heart design to demonstrate how you can use the same simple component to create three different projects.


To make the hearts for this bracelet you will need to download the Mini Diamond Earrings pattern from the International Beading Week collection of free patterns at:

This project is made using a Ladder stitched base and decreasing Brick stitch for the hearts, plus modified Right Angle Weave for the bracelet. Instructions for all stitches can be downloaded for free from The Beadworkers Guild website at: https://beadworkersguild.com/basic-stitchinstructions/

## Preparing the hearts

Using the earrings pattern, make twenty-four hearts two in each of the IBW colours, or use twelve different shades of one colour to create a 7 " $/ 17.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ ombre effect bracelet. N.B. You will need to adjust the quantities above to create a longer bracelet.


Make sure to pass through the top two beads of each heart a couple of times to strengthen their connection, then weave in, secure, and trim all threads, avoiding any beads near the top of each component.

## The bracelet

Step 1. Using a wingspan of stretched thread, pick up $6 x$ seed beads, leave an approx. $15-20 \mathrm{~cm}$ tail, then pass through the first two beads again.


Step 2. Miss a bead and pass through the next two beads, so that the missed bead pops out. Repeat once more.

Step 3. Pass through the first cylinder bead at the top of the yellow heart, pick up 1x seed bead and pass through the second cylinder bead - see diagram right.

Step 4. Pick up 5 x seed beads, pass through the two side beads from the previous unit and on through the next six beads - see diagram above.


Step 5. Miss a seed bead and pass through the next eight beads, to exit the two side beads of the second unit.


Step 6. Pick up 4x seed beads and pass through the two side beads of the previous unit.


Step 7. Miss a bead and pass through the next two beads.
Repeat twice more so that the missed beads pop out, exiting the two side beads of the
 new unit.

Step 8. Repeat Step 3, to add the orange heart, then repeat Steps 4 to 7.

Step 9. Continue repeating Steps 6 to 8 until you have added all twenty-four hearts, using the image on page one as a colour placement guide.

## N.B. Each heart will slightly overlap the

 previous one.Step 10. Repeat Steps 6 \& 7 to make the final unit.

## Adding the clasp

Step 10. Pick up $5 x$ seed beads, pass through the loop of the first half of the clasp - see diagram below.


Step 11. Pick up $2 x$ seed beads and pass through the third bead picked up in Step 11 - see diagram above.

Step 12. Pick up $2 x$ seed beads and pass through the two side beads of the last unit - see diagram below left.

Repeat the thread path for Steps $11-13$ a couple of times to strengthen the connection, then weave in, secure, and trim the thread.

Step 13. Repeat Steps 11-13 to add the second half of the clasp.
