## "BANGLE ONE" TUTORIAL

## Prerequisite

- Reading the entire tutorial before starting to bead
- Strong beadweaving experience
- Cubic Right-angle weave helps

Material List for a Bangle size $\sim 85 / 8^{\circ}(21.8 \mathrm{~cm})$ long before zipping

- 6.50 gr 3.4 Drop or Fringe beads, DB
- 9 gr MiniDuo, MD
- $3 \mathrm{gr} 11 / \mathrm{O}$ purple seedbeads, SB
- Beading thread - You may use your preferred beading thread. I used a double nylon thread.


## Legend

MD - MiniDuo
SB - Seadbead
DB - Drop bead

## Designer's notes:

- The measurements provided here are based on the widest part of a hand that is $75 / 8^{\prime \prime}(19.8 \mathrm{~cm})$. Remember that the bangle is a bit flexible and will roll on your hand to fit. To understand how to measure a fit of a bangle, this link, at the specific time of 10:09 might help-https://youtu.be/rqEHt1C9kD4
- There are 32 rows in this bangle (before and after zipping).
- Check out that both holes of MiniDuos are clear before starting.
- Finishing the thread - My favorite way is to weave the thread throughout my work in different directions until I am satisfied.

If you prefer to tie, glue, put nail polish or else, please do so. Any method that works for you is fine.

- If you print the tutorial, I recommend printing in color for better view of diagrams and pictures.
- Refer to the diagrams/pictures in each step.


## Bangle Rope

$\checkmark$ Thread length - Personal preference is recommended. Leave a tail long enough to be secured later.

Step 1 Finstrow - String an SB and an MD. Repeat 3 more times. Pass through the first SB and MD to make a tight circle. Come out the next SB.


Step 2 Second row - String a SB, DB and a SB. Pass through the SB you came out from and the next MD and SB. Repeat 3 more times. At the end of the row, go up through the first $S B$ of the set and the $D B$.

Step 3 Jhirdrow - At this row your rope will start to get its square shape. Pickup 1 MD and pass through the next $D B$. Continue to end of row. Pass through the first MD and up to its empty hole.


Step 4 - Fourthrow Pickup one SB and pass through the next MD. Repeat to end of row and come out the next $S B$.


Step 5 - Repeat steps 2-4 To desired length. The last row of the rope should be the same as the Secondrow in step 2 and the thread is coming out from a DB.

- Length of rope before zipping is $\sim 85 / 8^{\prime \prime}(21.8 \mathrm{~cm})$ This depends on tension and it may vary. As you measure your own fit, this is the time to remove or add rows, before zipping.


## Zipping the ends of the Rope

- Line up both ends of the rope in such away that they are on the same sides of the square, as in the picture below.
- Allign the beads from the First and Last rows, (logiclly they are


First row and Second row pattern) as in the picture above.

- Holding the working thread coming out of a $D B$, pass through the empty hole of the MD in the tail end of the rope and through the next $D B$.

- Continu all the way around and pull tight.
- Secure the thread.

- 11/O SB \#419 purple
- MiniDuo Lava M MA
- 3.4 Drop beads - OP turquoise



## Color way 2

- 11/O SB \#D4470 Miyuki red
- MiniDuo Lava M MA
- 3.4 Drop beads - FB D42O1 silver duracoat


## Color way 3

- 11/O SB 460D
- MiniDuo Pink
- 3.4 Drop beads Ruby Picasso



## Color way 4

- 11/O SB 46A midnight blue
- MiniDuo Chalk green luster
- 3.4 Drop beads capri C/L mint
